The Division of Parasitic Diseases and Malaria, Malaria Branch Program Implementation Unit, announces two career opportunities to serve as CDC Resident Advisors for the President's Malaria Initiative (PMI) in Nigeria and Guinea. We invite applications from medical officers (602 series), veterinary medical officers (701 series), and PhD epidemiologists (601 series) at grade level 14, and from Commissioned Corps officers at the O-5 and O-6 levels (though qualified candidates of lower rank will also be considered). Resident advisors will help design, implement, and evaluate key malaria prevention and control activities in close coordination with the host government and national and international partners, including the non-governmental and private sectors. This is an opportunity to contribute to one of PMI's largest and high-profile countries (Nigeria) or to an exciting new PMI program in a Francophone West African setting (Guinea). Both provide excellent opportunities for hands-on collaboration with national malaria

control programs, numerous international and non-governmental organizations, and local malaria and entomology research institutions. More information on PMI, as well as copies of the FY 2013 Malaria Operational Plans for Nigeria and Guinea, are available at www.pmi.gov.

Qualified candidates should have a strong background and interest in field epidemiology, monitoring and evaluation, surveillance, public health program implementation, demonstrated effective diplomatic and communications skills, and at least one to two years of public health experience in an international, developing country setting. In addition, French proficiency is critical to the resident advisor's effectiveness in Guinea and is required for that position. All candidates must already possess a **permanent U.S. Social Security number** to be considered.
