



PMI CONTRIBUTIONS TO DATE

22 countries in sub-Saharan Africa and the Greater Mekong Subregion have benefited from

\$4.3B in PMI funding to prevent, treat, and control malaria

RESULTS

PMI is contributing to global programs in malaria control.
From 2000–2015



6.2M

malaria deaths averted primarily among children under five in sub-Saharan Africa



48%

decline in malaria mortality

decline in malaria cases with the greatest progress occurring after 2005, when PMI was launched

Increase in the percentage of households owning at least 1 insecticide-treated net: **25% to 69%**



Increase in the number of children sleeping under insecticide-treated nets: **18% to 54%**

In PMI focus countries

17 countries saw reductions in all-cause mortality rates of children under five years of age



2.8x

Increase in the percentage of pregnant women sleeping under insecticide-treated nets: **17% to 48%**



2.7x

Increase in the percentage of women receiving 2 or more doses of intermittent preventive treatment for pregnant women for the prevention of malaria: **14% to 38%**
