Submission Requirements:

Please submit your high-resolution photos with caption and credit to pmi.usaid@gmail.com by **Tuesday, April 5, 2016 at 11:59 pm**. Photo submissions must follow the requirements below (no exceptions):

- High-resolution, high-quality photos that are at least 1024 pixels or larger (tall or wide) or around 300 pixels per inch. Please send the highest resolution photo possible (at least 1 MB).
- Accepted formats are high-quality JPG and JPEG.
- Photos must each include a credit: name of photographer and organizational affiliation (if applicable).
- Photos must each include:
 - City and country in which it was taken
 - Month, day and year during which it was taken
- Caption including who is in photo, what they are doing, and how it is a part of/relates to working to defeat malaria.
- Photos must each be an original submission (submitted by photographer or with permission).
- We will not accept a photo with an overlaid logo or text. Additionally, we will not accept a photo sent inside a Word document or PDF. Please send only the photo file.
- Individuals may submit up to five photos.

By submitting a photo, you give USAID the right to use it in current and future communications. Please contact pmi.usaid@gmail.com with any questions. We will notify you via email if your photo has been chosen as a winning entry.
